

About Tsubame

Tsubame has been widely known for its metalworking industry represented by metal cutlery.

The history dates back to the early Edo period (1603-1868). Since Tsubame was prone to flooding, in order to rescue rice farmers of the area, making Japanese-style nails as a side business was encouraged. Then the farmers expanded into the production of Tsuiki Copperware, files, kiseru tobacco pipes and so on. In the Taisho period (1912-1926), production of metal cutlery began thriving, and introduction of machines allowed stable manufacturing.

Today, high-quality products made in Tsubame continue to fascinate people around the world.

Creating hammered patterns on a copper beer cup

In this workshop, hammering the surface of a copper beer cup, you make hammered patterns on it. You can try one of the processes of Tsuiki Copperware which is a traditional handicraft of Tsubame. Enjoy making your very original cup!

Creating hammered patterns on a nickel silver shot cup

Make patterns on the surface of a shot cup with a hammer. Nickel silver has been used as a valuable material in Tsubame since the Taisho period. Fees | 2,000yen Required time | Approx. 30min Capacity | 3 people per session Admission is separate.



Making a nickel silver coffee spoon

Die-cut the body shape of the spoon, and dent the flat spoon to make a bowl with a manual press machine. Enjoy making a little coffee spoon in simple processes.

Fees | 300yen Required time | Approx. 10min Capacity | 3 people Admission is separate.



Anodizing a titanium spoon

When the current is passed through the titanium, it is anodized. This process makes the titanium color. The color of titanium changes depending on the strength of the voltage. 24 color variation is available.
